Maize is Kharip Corp it requires temperature between 21°C to 27°C. Maize producing states are Karnataka. Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Andhra Pradesh. It is rainfed. Khairp as well as Rabi-crop. All these crops are very important in India.

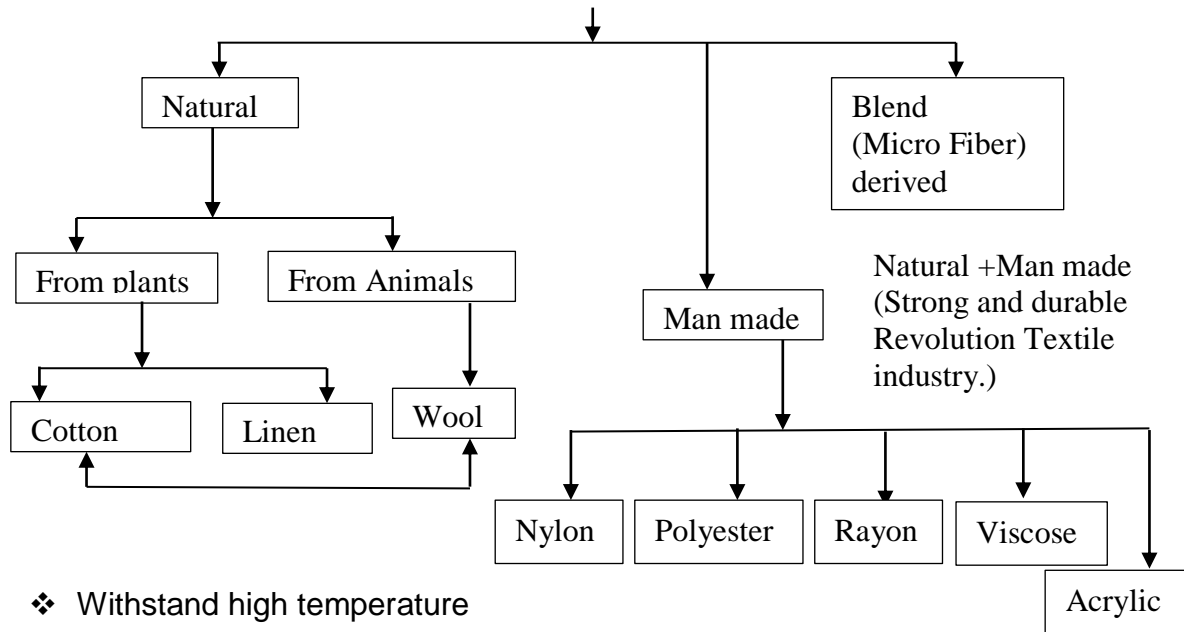
